Chelsea C. White received his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan (UM) in 1974 in Computer, Information, and Control Engineering. He has served on the faculties of the University of Virginia (1976 - 1990) and UM (1990 -2001). He has served as School Chair of the H. Milton Stewart School of Industrial & Systems Engineering (2005 -10) and holds the Schneider National Chair of Transportation and Logistics at the Georgia Institute of Technology, where he is the former Director of the Trucking Industry Program (TIP) and the former Executive Director of The Logistics Institute. While at the University of Michigan, he was the founding Engineering Co-Director of what is now the Tauber Institute for Global Operations. He serves on the boards of directors for the Industry Studies Association and the Bobby Dodd Institute, is a member of the Board of Advisors for TransFX, a futures and options marketplace for transportation capacity, and is a former member of the board of directors for Con-way, Inc. (NYSE: CNW, 2004-2015), The Logistics Institute-Asia Pacific, ITS America (a Utilized Federal Advisory Committee), and the ITS World Congress. He has been a keynote speaker at a variety of international conferences and meetings and has provided testimony to legislative committees at the Federal and State levels. He is a Fellow of the IEEE, a Fellow of INFORMS, and a former member of the World Economic Forum trade facilitation council.
