Garland Chow is Associate Professor in the Operations and Logistics Division and Director of the Bureau of Intelligent Transportation Systems and Freight Security both in the Sauder School of Business at the University of British Columbia. Dr. Chow teaches and writes in the fields of supply chain, business logistics and freight transport management. He has taught over 4000 students in the U.S., Canada, Australia, Brazil, China, Hong Kong, Japan, Mexico, Poland and the UK, and is a frequent speaker before professional associations and executive programs

Dr. Chow is a member of several editorial boards and an active participant in the Canadian Association of Supply Chain & Logistics Management which awarded him their 2003 National Mentor Award and 2008 National Service Award. He also serves on the accreditation review panel of the Canadian Supply Chain Sector Council. He was recently appointed to the National Board of the Purchasing Management Association of Canada and the Chair of the Education Committee.

He has published over 200 articles and reports in the supply chain field. His current research interests include: off shore and near shore sourcing strategy and evaluation, total logistics costs decision making, and the modelling of security and efficiency of cross border and global freight movement.
